Dear Families and Friends,

Over the past two days we have welcomed education consultant and critical friend Kath Murdoch into our school to work with our staff on our approach to inquiry learning. Kath has worked with each teaching team, including the executive over the past two days around planning and teaching, curating inquiry spaces, shared and personal inquiries for both student and adult learners and the language of learning through our learning assets. It is such a privilege to have Kath work with us at Bonython and we will share some of the feedback we get about our progress as an inquiry mindset school in the next bulletin.

Over the past fortnight we have been involved in a special project that will feed into the ACT Principal conference in three weeks' time. Our two senior student leaders, Mia and Asha, who are part of the ACT Student Congress were filmed by senior students from Dickson College, sending messages of advice to Principals on, 'What makes a good leader?' In addition to this thirty-two students from preschool to year 6 have written a postcard to a leader about one of these two provocations:

- 1) What capabilities or dispositions do you think are important for students to develop?
- 2) What do you think are the most important attributes of a school leader? (Principal / Deputy Principal)

The Principals will receive their postcards during the conference and the idea is that they will then write back to our students. Our school was asked because of the emphasis we place on student voice and agency. There are seven other schools involved in this project.

All students at Bonython Primary School benefit each year from the voluntary contributions made from our families. This year we are hoping collectively to reach the target of \$14000. Voluntary contribution are set by our School Board and begins at \$110 for one child and a slight increase for more than one child at the school. The contributions that each family make have impact on what resources we are able to provide for all students at the school.

We regularly put reminders on our Facebook page about the need for all of our families and community members to park in the allocated bays in our three designated car parks. When individuals park in places that aren't permitted it becomes a safety consideration for both community members and the students that attend our school. This includes parking in designated drop off and pick up areas and our two disabled car parking bays. Please ensure you are being community minded and following the rules of the road. Just as if we would if you were parking at the Tuggeranong Business District.

We are looking forward to our swimming carnival next Tuesday and an opportunity to connect with community at a whole school event. If possible, we hope to see you at the Tuggeranong Pool. Please come and have a chat and let me know how your year has started for your children.

2019 SSACT 12YRS & UNDER TRACK & FIELD TEAM SELECTION CRITERIA

All students that wish to nominate and be considered for selection for the ACT Team, need to **register** with School Sport ACT via the online portal to attend the Track & Field Selection Trials on 20 and 26 March 2019. Note – there are separate qualifying standards to be able to enter the trials.

Registrations will close on Friday 15 March 2019

The selected team will be announced via email out to selected students by **Sunday 14 April 2019**. A preliminary team meeting will be held on Thursday 2 May 2019 (week 1 of term 2) 4.30pm – 5.30pm at ACT Sports House in Hackett. A follow up meeting and uniform try-on will be held on Thursday 4 July 2019. (Further details later)

The following general selection procedures for the 2019 School Sport Australia (SSA) 12 Years & Under Track & Field Championships shall apply:

(a) The students must have competed in the 2019 School Sport ACT (SSACT) Track & Field Trials held on 20 and 26 March 2019, unless evidence can be provided for one of the below reasons:

- • Medical reason – medical certificate to cover day of Trials.
- • Participating in another School Sport ACT team/event on day of Trials.
- • Participating in a school activity on the day of Trials – Letter from school/principal verifying the school activity.
- • Having sufficient evidence does not guarantee selection into the team.

(b) The students are in the correct age category, i.e. must be turning a minimum age of ten (10) and a maximum age of twelve (12) in the year of competition.

(c) They attend a school full-time in the ACT that is affiliated with SSACT or an ACT educational facility that caters for students with a disability.

(d) Team selection will be based on the number of competitors per event in the SSA Track & Field program and any limit set on the maximum number of team members allowed by SSA and/or SSACT.

(e) Qualifying standards are used as a guide and selection is at selectors' discretion.

(f) Should a student decline their offer of selection or a team member withdraws before the SSA 12&U Track & Field Championships, or not be available for a particular event, selectors *may* select a replacement.

(g) Multi-Class (Para) Athletes – the selection process for multi-class athletes differs to that for able bodied athletes. Multi-Class athletes will also be advised of their selection following the ACT T&F Trials.

2019 SSACT 12&U Track & Field Team Selection Process

(a) Individual event selections in the first instance will be based primarily on performances and place at the 2019 SSACT Track & Field Trials.

(b) Students sick, injured or on another sanctioned school event with sufficient/satisfactory evidence *may* also be considered where spaces are available.

(c) Relay teams - 4 x 100m and Medley - will be selected from across 100m runners *and* the other events to form the most competitive teams possible from available students in each age group/gender, once the whole team has been finalised.

(d) Other relay teams (non-competitive) will be selected from within the team after the final team has been selected and confirmed.

(e) Combined Event (includes: 100m + 800m + long jump + shot put): Students can only compete in the combined event disciplines as a whole at the SSA Championships OR their original selected individual events. They cannot do both. *(Note that students generally need to have been selected into the team in the first instance in an individual event to then be considered for the combined event. Please indicate within the on-line registration process in "playing history" if you wish to nominate and be considered for the combined event. Include above event performances if not done at ACT Trials.)*
