Karen Wilson won the Primary Teacher of The Year award and was acknowledged for her outstanding leadership in developing a whole school inquiry into cultural integrity, connection to the land and reconciliation. These concepts were represented through our amazing art exhibition 'Acknowledging Country'.

I would like to thank our P&C Committee for their significant efforts in the organisation of this years' school fete. Unfortunately, the weather was very unkind to us on the day meaning that some last minute changes and adjustments needed to take place. A big thank you to all our community members who came along and volunteered or supported on the day. If you still have any raffle tickets could you please return them to the school, sold or unsold. Every ticket needs to be accounted for as part of the competition conditions.

Throughout the year teachers and students at Bonython Primary have been using the outdoors as part of their classroom. 

#### Safe parking behaviours
