Dear Families and Friends,

End of Semester 1 reports were emailed out to families last Friday. This has been a huge administration task that has required a number of troubleshooting steps along the way. I would like to thank Ben White and Sandie Watt who have done a lot of the heavy lifting ensuring that the reports were ready by the Friday deadline. If you have not received the report it is likely we do not have your current email address. Please update your details with Sandie in the front office. Shortly we will be asking families for feedback about the reporting processes for Semester one, in particular whether the report gives you enough information about your child's progress.

We would like to let the wider community know that we have a staff personnel change for Term 3. Miss Dannielle Fisher has been successful in obtaining a School Leader C position at Namadgi school until the end of 2019. She is due to commence this position at the beginning of next term. Miss Fisher's replacement will be Mrs Melissa Troth. Melissa is an experienced teacher and has taught in the Queanbeyan region for the past 7 years. I am currently negotiating a start date for Melissa; however, it is likely to be at the beginning of next term. This will be a permanent appointment to Bonython and to our education system.

The other staffing change will be Mrs Kyleigh Howell who will be taking some leave for Term 3 to travel around outback Australia. Miss Katherine Spencer, who has been working with Kyleigh on her final teaching practicum, will be the classroom teacher. Katherine has had an outstanding practicum and has a very promising career ahead of her. We welcome her to Bonython Primary School in her first official teaching role.

We would like to remind our families the importance of minimising personal belongings coming to school. Toys, footballs, tennis ball and jewellery are not necessary items that need to come to school as part of the regular school routines. They can sometimes be a distraction or cause some conflict amongst students. If your child does choose to bring personal belongings to school, please make sure it has their name clearly marked on the item. Students also need to look after personal belongings and the school is not responsible if things do go missing.

All students at Bonython Primary School benefit each year from the voluntary contributions made from our families. This year we are hoping collectively to reach the target of \$14000. Voluntary contributions are set by our School Board and begins at \$110 for one child and a slight increase for more than one child at the school. The contributions that each family make have impact on what resources we are able to provide for all students at the school.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all our families for another fantastic term. We appreciate the community spirit that each and every one of you brings to our wonderful school environment. Please stay safe over the school holiday period, enjoy your time with family and loved ones and we look forward to seeing everyone again when school recommences on Monday 22 July 2019.

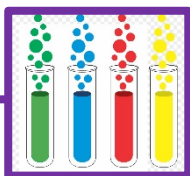

PARKING RESTRICTIONS PROTECT SAFETY

Parking restrictions are used around schools to increase safety for children. Some of the [common signage](#) used in school zones includes:

- No stopping – vehicles are not permitted to stop or park for any purpose
- No parking – vehicles are permitted to stop, however only to pick up or set down passengers and must drive on within two minutes of stopping
- Bus zone – the area is reserved for use by buses only, unless signposted for other use at certain times
- Children's crossing – a part-time crossing that operates when one or more crossing flags are displayed, giving all pedestrians priority over vehicles.
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Parking Operations and police regularly patrol school zones to enforce safe behaviours, so please remember to play your part in helping to build a safe school environment.

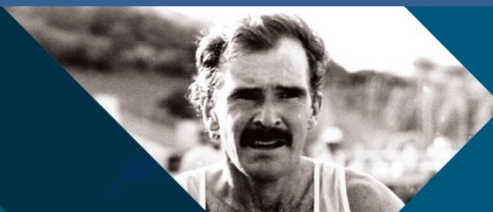
